

PERFORMING ARTS MIDDLE SCHOOL

The Middle School Program at the ACPA Academy is an entry level program for students in year 9 who display exceptional talent in performing arts. Students accepted into the program will work in a small group setting each receiving individualised support and mentoring.

Personal academic excellence and education is one of our top priorities across the board in academic, dance and performing arts studies. Students who are studying in the middle school program will complete their year 9 studies through Open Access College. The program will allow students to participate in face-to-face learning via a virtual platform. Students are closely monitored by the ACPA Academy's Head of Education, who will have access to their academic record. Ensuring all students are on track and meeting their academic requirements.

Students will train and study at our ACPA campus 5 days a week, 8:15am – 3:00pm. Participating in academic studies and performing arts training each day.

We know the students entering this program don't just have talent! They are all hard-working like-minded individuals who are looking to pursue a career in the arts. Students are awarded a position in the course based on an audition and interview process.




ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Acceptance into the Middle School Program is via audition only. Online submissions are available for students interstate and or in rural areas.

All applicants must show evidence of previous dance training in a minimum of two genres and have potential in singing and acting.

Students entering the High School Program, must present their current academic records, as their academic standard must be maintained to retain their position.

PERFORMING ARTS HIGH SCHOOL

The High School Program here at the ACPA Academy is a full-time pre-professional program for elite students in years 10, 11 and 12. This program supports students who are looking to fast track their training whilst completing their SACE studies. This intensive program sees students training approximately 18 hours per week

Students enrolling into the high school program undertake their academic subjects at Thebarton Senior College as part of the Special Interest Academy. The Special Interest Academy offers an integrated learning program that allows student to combine subjects and reduce their workload, with teachers focusing on tailoring the learning to the needs and interest of each individual.

Genres: Music Theatre, Jazz, Tap, Contemporary, Lyrical, Ballet, Commercial, Choreography, Acting, Audition Techniques, Vocal and more.

Entry requirements - to demonstrate a strong dance ability in at least 2 styles and or a strong vocal/acting ability and at least 1 dance style.

Year 10 students are entering their development year, where we help them identify their strengths and weaknesses and establish clear academic/performing arts goals. We offer one on one support and guidance as they transition from a traditional school environment into two days of academic studies and three days of performing arts training.

Year 11 students participate in up to 18 hours a week of performing arts classes. These classes are in a variety of different genres that focus on enhancing the students' performance skills and technique development.

Whilst Year 12 students are completing their SACE certificate and working towards achieving an ATAR, they are also focusing on bridging the gap between high school and full time pre professional training. These students are provided the chance to start working towards preparing themselves for the industry and audition opportunities.

CUA30120 CERTIFICATE III IN DANCE

The Certificate III in Dance is perfect for school age students looking to advance their education and bridge the pathway between school and fulltime training.

This course is offered one day a week with students also participating in technique classes such as jazz, ballet and music theatre. These students are presented with the opportunity to gain industry skills in a variety of different areas, while increasing their technical ability.

Students who successfully complete their Certificate III in dance can achieve up to 70 Stage 2 credits to put towards their SACE Certificate.

Entry requirements - Individuals must complete an audition or provide another form of evidence which demonstrates their competence in at least one dance style equivalent to Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) level 2 or above.

DIPLOMA OF PROFESSIONAL DANCE (ELITE)

The Diploma of Dance (Elite Performance) is the next step for students who are looking to further their professional dance training. Run as a full-time program, this course can be completed over 1 or 2 years.

Unlike the certificate courses, the Diploma reflects the role of dancers working or aspiring to work in the professional world. This includes being a performer, teacher and/or choreographer. The course allows students to focus their energy on fine tuning their skills and knowledge in their chosen industry. At this level the individual students are expected to apply theory and creative skills in real-world situations.

Entry requirement - Individuals must complete an audition or provide another form of evidence which demonstrates their competence in at least one dance style equivalent to Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) level 4 or above.

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS

All applicants may audition either in person or via online video submission. In person auditions include:

- Two solos performed in different genres (Minimum of 1 minute each)
- A short tap sequences (Minimum 64 counts If experienced in Tap)
- Perform a monologue (Minimum 2 minutes)
- Perform a vocal piece in the style of musical theatre or pop

If you are not able to make our open auditions, a private audition can be arranged.

Online video submissions include:

- Three x 1-minute solos showcasing Jazz, Ballet and any genre of your choice
- A short tap sequences (Minimum 64 counts If experienced in Tap)
- Perform a monologue (Minimum 2 minutes)
- Perform a vocal piece in the style of musical theatre or pop
- Include a cover letter stating your goals and future aspirations as well as a CV
